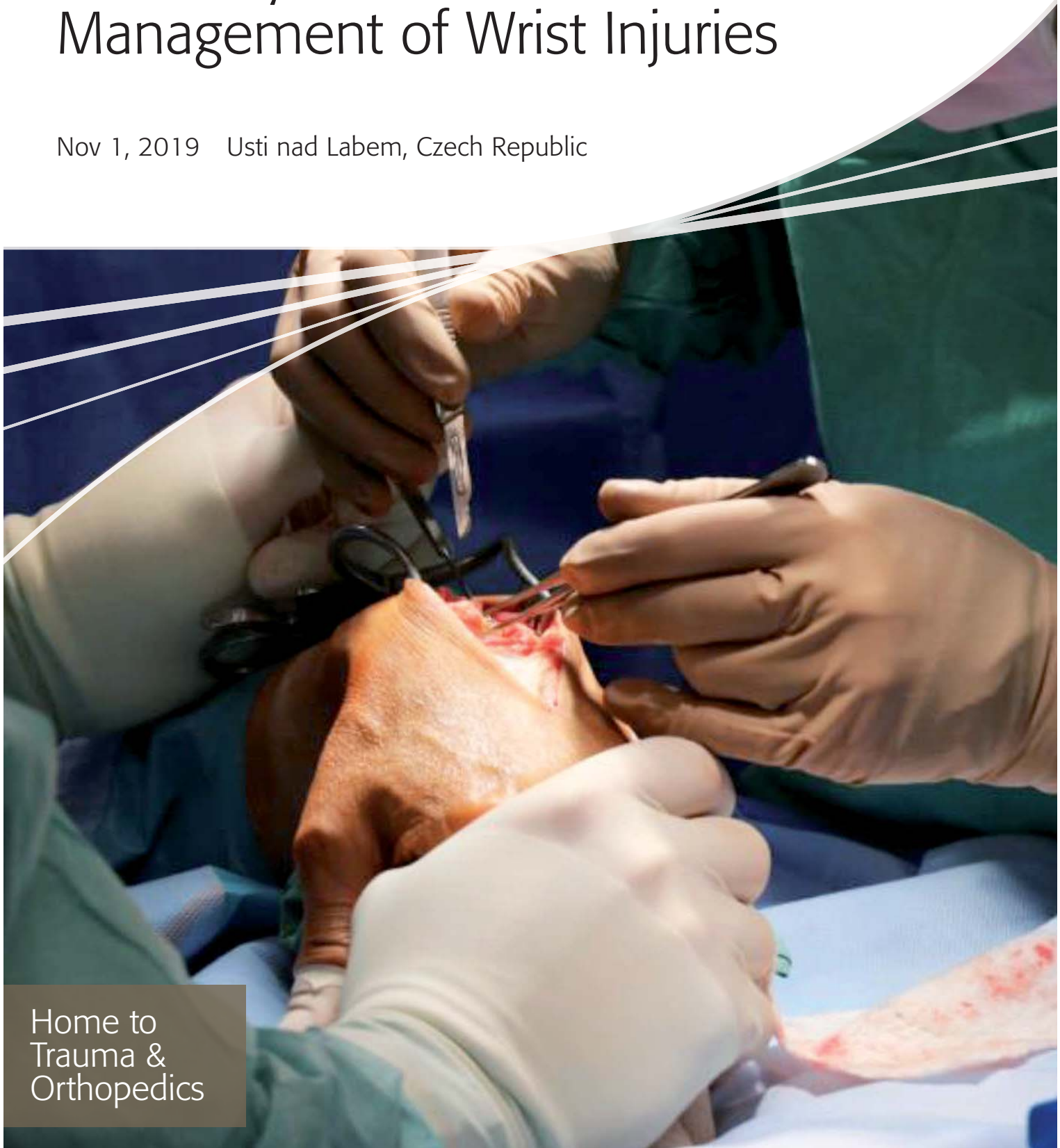

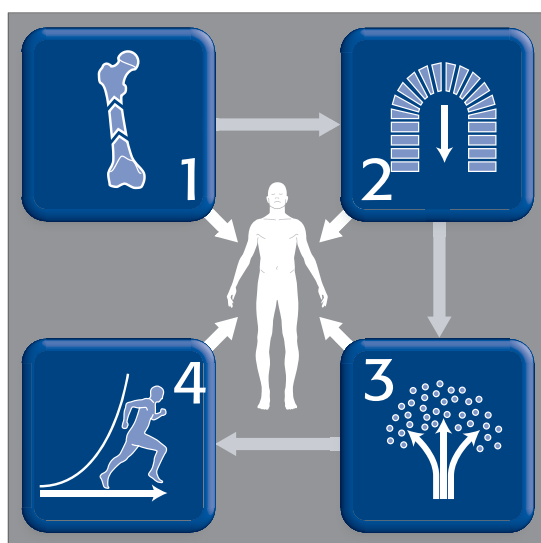
Value statement

The AO principles of fracture management

Fracture reduction and fixation to restore anatomical relationships.

Early and safe mobilization and rehabilitation of the injured part and the patient as a whole.



Fracture fixation providing absolute or relative stability, as required by the “personality” of the fracture, the patient, and the injury.

Preservation of the blood supply to soft tissues and bone by gentle reduction techniques and careful handling.

The first AO Course was held in Davos in 1960 – these early courses pioneered psychomotor techniques by teaching practical skills of AO Techniques. Since those early days over 250,000 surgeons and 135,000 ORP staff from over 110 countries have attended AO Courses – we now launch AOTrauma to move our education to the next level.

Goal of the seminar

Cílem symposia je poskytnout zkušeným chirurgům ruky ucelený pohled na problematiku kostního a vazového poranění zápěstí s důrazem na nejnovější postupy v jejich léčbě. Ačkoliv klasické AO principy v léčbě zlomenin zápěstí jsou více či méně konstantní, v léčbě vazových poranění přetrvávají stále kontroverze, ať se jedná o léčbu izolovaných poranění nebo poranění asociovaných se zlomeninami zápěstí. Symposií zabývajících se touto problematikou v naší republice není mnoho.

- komplexně seznámeni s nejnovějšími pokroky i kontroverzemi v léčbě poranění zápěstí
- znát nejnovější trendy v léčbě zlomenin a vazových poranění zápěstí

Kurz povzbuzuje interaktivní diskuzi a výměnu zkušeností mezi účastníky a fakultou.
